1. **Membership Dues:** 40% goes to state and supreme for costs and 25% of members pay no dues or only \$15.00
2. **Catering:** down due to the economy
3. **Office Building:** down due to the economy
4. **Lounge:** very low due to lack of membership support
5. **50/50:** very low due to lack of membership support

— WE HAVE MORE EXPENSES THAN INCOME —

If these areas don't improve, drastic cuts will have to be implemented, as we cannot continue to withdraw from our savings or we will be broke in a few years.

We must help ourselves by promoting our caterer, our lounge, office building and 50/50 tickets. Unless we band together in unity we face the same fate that many businesses and K of C councils have – **Close our Doors!**

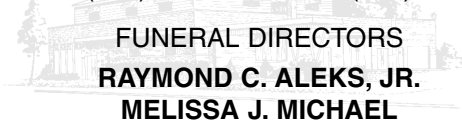
